issue, because it can become very divisive.

**Q. I have heard some talk about exempting seniors from paying school property taxes because they have no children in school. What is the impact on a county when this is done?**

A. Originally and for many years, the only counties to offer a senior property tax exemption in the past have usually been larger metro counties who have a large industrial/commercial tax base to help pay the lost income of school property taxes. But in smaller

counties with less industry, the burden to make up the school taxes from those exempted must fall directly on the younger tax payers who are still working and are not retired. Usually, but not always, this is the group that have house payments, car payments and the burden of raising a young family. Generally in retirement, while the income may be less, the payments are usually drastically less with more disposable income, fewer debts and hopefully no children to raise.

and are willing to just rely on short "bullet-points" that keep repeating themselves, as if hearing them often enough makes the report true, really only get what the government sends out, without independent investigation.

A few books have really opened my eyes lately to the depth of what is going on in our Country. One is *Stonewalled*, written by a 30-year veteran investigative journalist who covered controversial matters in both the Clinton and George W. Bush administrations, but who reports the difference in trying to cover the present administration, which refuses to provide the legally-accessible information under the Freedom of Information Act, to ensure Freedom of the Press. TV News Awards, an independent panel, presents Emmys for superior stories reported, and last year the author, Sharyl Attkin-son was nominated for three in-depth investigations, which bears witness to her veracity and honesty.

Another book worth reading is *Injustice*, which was written by an attorney who had worked in the Department of

Justice for several years, even pre-dating this Administration, before he quit in order to be a whistleblower for irregularities and illegalities performed in the current administration, with Eric Holder at the helm.

I also read *13 Hours in Benghazi*, written by people on the ground during the attack, which is an eye-opening account, completely opposite from the stories we heard from the administration or in sound bites on TV. I heartily recommend this book as well.

Anyone truly interested in uncovering the truth about what has been deemed the most closed administration in current times, which provides the news outlets the stories it wants printed, without allowing independent investigation, can spend the time to learn, rather than just eat the pablum that the media dishes out.

An informed electorate is the only safeguard for our government as originally founded, with the explicit obligation that in order to preserve this unique government an informed electorate is required!

Truly, all that is needed is an attorney on retainer.

If the schools exist for what happens between the students and their teachers, why are administrators paid so much more — to do what? Certainly not to teach.

Why don't Union County school administrators teach just one class each day? That would mean an additional 1,260 hours of instruction each year — at no increase in cost.

No administrator should be paid more than the highest paid teacher. That would reduce the ranks of administrators who flee the

classroom for the salary increases.

Over my career, I've driven a school bus, have coached, taught, tutored, served as department chair, principal and headmaster, have been an Adjunct Instructor. I hold two Master's Degrees: one in Educational Administration and the other — the real one — is Academic. A Doctorate in Education isn't a real Graduate Degree — but, it gives the school board the image that it seeks and the authority to award awards where awards should not be awarded.
