Now in its third year, the Union County School System will host a Veterans Day program on Tuesday, Nov. 10, to honor veterans for their service.

The ceremony will begin at 10 a.m. in Mike Colwell Memorial Stadium, and veterans can attend a free breakfast before the ceremony, from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., in the Union County High School cafeteria.

Parking for the event will be next to the stadium at Union County Elementary School, and veterans attending the breakfast can take a bus from the parking area to the high school, then back to the



stadium for the program.

"We believe our Veterans Day Program is the best overall program we do each year," said Union County Schools

Superintendent Gary Steppe. "It is an opportunity to thank our veterans for their service and sacrifice for our country and all who live here. Our students

and teachers are proud to have the opportunity to honor these brave men and women, and they have taken a lot of ownership in making it a real success."

For Steppe and the school system at large, Veterans Day offers the community and its students an opportunity to study American history, including the living testaments to freedom that endure in the nation's population of veterans.

"We study in our school books about the threats and wars our nation has faced since its origin, but reading about it isn't the same as sitting in the bleachers at Mike Colwell Stadium and honoring these
