roast coffee beans on site. The menu will include specialty coffee and coffee blend products, other blended drinks, fresh baked goods, soups, sandwiches and other food items.

The Blairsville location marks the 11th franchise for Cabin Coffee Co. in the United States. The company also has locations in Colorado, Iowa, Minnesota, and

Wisconsin.

Blairsville will be Cabin Coffee Co.'s first location in Georgia.

In other restaurant news, Chick-fil-A is expected to be open in June or July. Work has begun on the site location. The eatery will be adjacent to Fatz on Georgia 515.

Representatives for Chick-fil-A submitted a sign permit application that was ap-

proved at the regular meeting of the Blairsville City Council on Tuesday, Sept. 2.

According to the Union County Building and Development Department, Chick-fil-A has submitted three site plans so far. The most recent submission dates to July 22, 2014.

The July 2014 plan illustrates a 4,528-square-foot building, with seating for 96

patrons within the restaurant, and outdoor seating to accommodate 15. Parking is proposed to have 49 regular spaces to 3 handicap spaces, totaling 52 parking spots.

Chick-fil-A bought the 1.02-acre lot from W. C. Nelson of Nelson Tractor Company, who also owns the piece of land between the proposed site of Chick-fil-A and Plott Street.

have included different methods of fraud.

"The vast majority of these scams originate outside the Continental United States," she said. "Union County residents need to be aware of these scams or forms of fraud and take precautions when considering the validity

of the request received.

Capt. Williams says if you receive any requests to send money in order to receive any type of winnings, etc., it is a scam.

"Always remember, never, ever give your personal information out over the phone or in an e-mail," she said. "If

you receive a suspicious e-mail or an e-mail from an unknown source, don't open it. If you are asked for your bank account numbers, social security number, or date of birth, don't give this information out.

"We here at the Union County Sheriff's Office are

constantly striving to protect our citizens from any potential harm that could arise from these predators who are seeking to defraud you," she said. "If you have any questions, or we may be of assistance to you, please do not hesitate to call us at (706) 439-6066.

facated. He released Farner on an OR bond, his own recognition, Union County Superior Court records show.

Two weeks after his release, the Union County Sheriff's Office investigators were looking into allegations that Farner had molested a third victim. After an investi-

gation by UCSO Investigator Andrew Hammond, charges were brought against Farner again. On Nov. 24, Farner was charged with child molestation and sexual battery, SSgt. Darren Osborn said.

"Basically, we believe Mr. Farner will go to trial on the new charges," Sgt. Os-

born said. "From what I understand, the previous charges, well, it's up to the District Attorney what happens on those counts. I can't speak for the District Attorney."

Farner is being held in the Union County Jail, Sgt. Osborn said.
